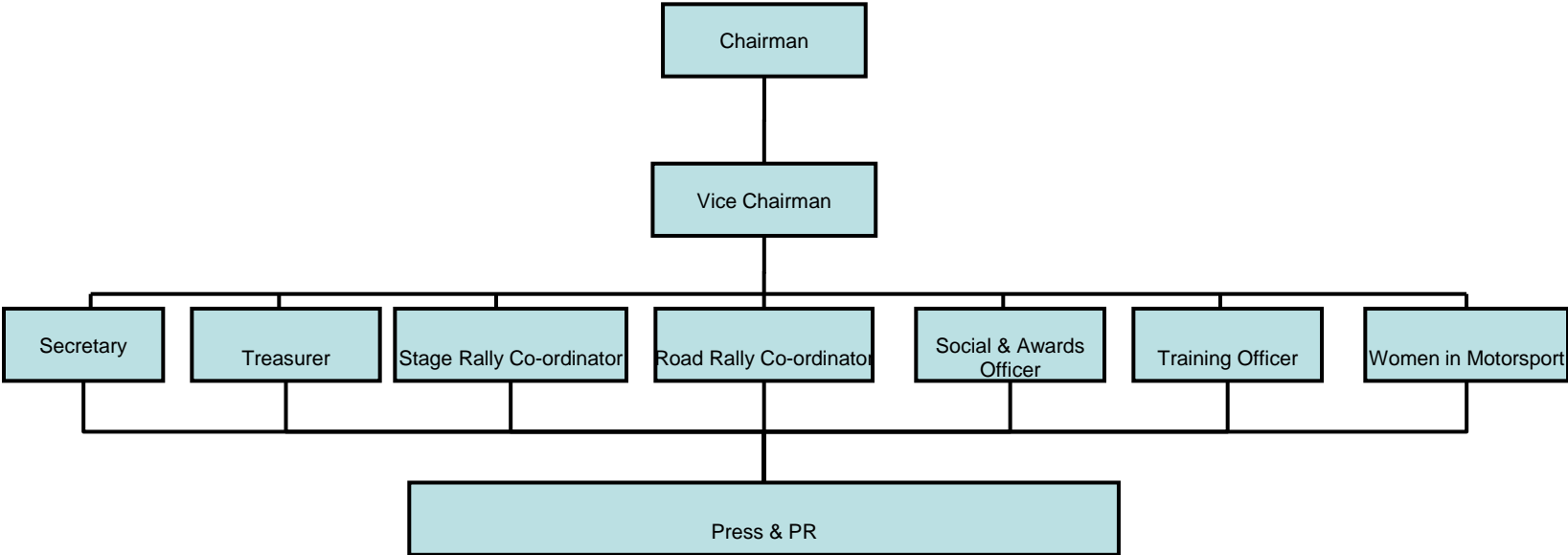

History of the Association

ANEMMC was founded in 1971 out of a previous organisation – the Lincolnshire Association of motor clubs. It was formed with some 15 clubs. It has since expanded to its present size of 38 member clubs. The Association goes from strength to strength both in size and its effectiveness in meeting its aims.

Club delegates meet together 4 times each year. At each meeting a visitor will be invited to address the meeting on some topical issue. Minutes of these proceedings are sent to all member clubs.

Association Activities

The Association runs two very competitive and popular Championships – the Stage Rally Championship and the Road Rally Championship. It also participates in the Inter Association Challenges as well as a full programme of Social events including the Annual Dinner and Awards Presentation



Aims of the Association

- To provide support to member clubs in the region
- To provide a channel of communication for motor clubs directly between the MSA and its committees
- To provide regional championships for the benefit of members of member clubs

Aims continued

- To provide a structure for motor sport in a geographical region.
- To provide an opportunity for member clubs to share information by all available means.
- To provide an opportunity for member clubs to receive representatives from motor sport and other like-minded bodies.
- To encourage wider participation in motor sport.

Aims continued

- To improve purchasing power of clubs when buying equipment.
- To provide a pool of expertise for member clubs to draw on.
- To prepare policies and guidelines for member clubs.
- To provide a structured platform for training marshal, competitors and officials.

The Way Forward

- The Association intends to continue to meet its aims.
- The Association aims to promote itself and its member clubs through the press and other media.
- Youth in the Association is a high priority. An ageing executive needs new blood.

The Way Forward

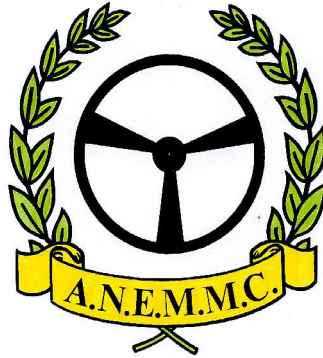
- To encourage new competitors, marshals and spectators into the sport.

- Closer links with other sports throughout the region.
- The use of Regional Development Officers to further motor sport.

- To encourage member clubs to follow guidelines on Health & Safety, welfare and Child Protection issues.
- A programme to encourage new officials into the management of events.
- The Development Plan will be reviewed through its lifetime to enable member clubs to grow and prosper
